Transforming Homeless Families

Breaking Generational Cycles

Ramona was sober for twelve years before the first wave of the Coronavirus pandemic swept across the state in 2020. As the lockdowns began, Ramona was laid off from her job and, due to her struggles with mental illness, she spiraled into a very dark place.

"I was unraveling," says Ramona. "It felt like everything I built was falling apart."

And so, she coped as she had years ago—with drugs.

"Once I relapsed, I knew it was over for me," Ramona shares as she reflects on the downward spiral that took place.

She was hosting people in her home to help cover rent, and one night, the police caught them selling drugs. Even though Ramona wasn't involved in the sale, she was arrested because it was her apartment. She lost her home, and her daughter was taken by DCF.

"That hurt me so bad because when I got pregnant with her, I promised that I wouldn't let her go through what I went through."

After her time in prison, Ramona went to a drug rehab facility. She learned how to work on herself and got clean once more.

"This time, as I was working through the twelve steps, it was different," says Ramona. "I realized that something was missing, and what was missing was Jesus. We can't do nothing in this life without God."

Ramona was baptized in the rehab facility. She started reading her Bible, going to church, and doing whatever she had to do to get her daughter back. Within six months, she was reunified with her daughter but didn't have any income or a place to go. She ended up staying with her mother, but there was no space for them alongside the nine others living in the three-bedroom home.

"I was overwhelmed - desperate for a safe place for myself and my daughter," Ramona says. "That was when my DCF case manager told me about New Life Mission."

Ramona applied but was afraid that she wouldn't get accepted because of her recent arrest and DCF case. She was overjoyed when she got the call that she was accepted.

"When I got the call that I was accepted into the program, I was on my knees and I thanked God because I felt like I was finally getting somewhere."

Since being in the program, Ramona has received mental health counseling that has helped her tremendously on her journey of sobriety and selfsufficiency.

"I remember coming through the gates of New Life Mission like a broken bird. Every day and week that went by, I felt myself being put back together again," says Ramona. "I feel like I have been healed from the inside out."

At New Life Mission, we provide moms with more than just a safe place to live - we equip them with the tools and support to move their families to selfsufficiency.


Thousands of dollars are spent every spring and summer by groups traveling the world on mission trips to help those in need. Backyard Missions is a great opportunity for you to rally your church group, co-workers, family and friends to take up a donation, host a paper products drive, volunteer for a project at one of our four Melbourne campuses or invite us to speak and share what we do.

At the time of this writing, we are serving 78 women and their children. In addition to our moms with 1, 2 and 3 children, we currently have moms with 4, 5 and 6 children!

For the two years they are with us, we not only provide a safe place to live, but we also empower families with the wraparound resources and support they need to move out of homelessness for good. 90% of the families who complete our program do not return to homelessness!

As an organization that does not utilize government funding, we look to individuals, churches, businesses and foundations to keep our doors open. Let's go on (backyard) mission together!


